

CRITERIA FOR INCLUSION/EXCLUSION

Family Resource and Referral Center, 2-1-1 San Joaquin Service Provider, established the following guidelines for inclusion in or exclusion from the 2-1-1 San Joaquin Database, following the AIRS Standards.

CRITERIA FOR INCLUSION

All agencies must meet the following minimum criteria in order to be considered for inclusion in the 2-1-1 San Joaquin database of resources.

- Demonstrate service capacity and proof of service provision for at least 6 months.

Agencies meeting the above minimum criteria, may be included in the 2-1-1 San Joaquin resource database under the following categories:

1. Not-for-profit agencies with 501(c) designation, providing social, educational, legal, community, consumer, health or human services to residents of San Joaquin. Agencies must provide proper documentation regarding tax-exempt status (e.g. certificate of not-for-profit status, 501(c) designation, or federal tax-exempt letter from US Department of Treasury/Internal Revenue Service on official letterhead.)
2. Not-for-profit organizations and agencies including faith based groups, churches, social clubs). Such organizations must provide services to the general community, not restricting services to members of their faith or organizations.
3. Government (federal, local, state) and quasi-public agencies that provide services to the general community including human services, social services, consumer protection/services, legal services, environmental protection, criminal justice, and others. 2-1-1 San Joaquin will attempt to list all government agencies and their various departments and programs.
4. Local, statewide, and nationwide toll-free phone services or websites that can be accessed by clients in San Joaquin, that provide a socially beneficial service, and that are administered by government or not-for-profit organizations.
5. Acute care hospitals. Only the acute/urgent care centers of for-profit hospitals will be included. Other hospital programs and services offered to patients will not be included in the resource database.
6. Community clinics including federally qualified Community Health Centers.
7. Advocacy groups and community coalitions.
8. Self-help support groups that do not charge a fee or charge a nominal fee. 2-1-1 San Joaquin will include state, regional, or national headquarters to enable tracking of local support groups that may frequently change, contacts or sites.
9. Organizations that are designated, funded, or contracted by the government to provide specific social services. Private providers offering MediCal reimbursable services are not included in this criterion.
10. Professional associations providing a public service (e.g. information and referral).
